

MAF's approach is to work in partnership with stakeholders such as subsistence and commercial farmers, importers, exporters, and agro-processors; and in collaboration with their associated public agencies, NGOs and service providers.

OFFICE OF THE CEO

1. LEGAL

To represent the Ministry in all court matters, both civil and criminal, with the authorization of the Attorney General and the Executive Director of the National Prosecution Office.


2. AUDIT

The unit provides an independent review of internal control systems, standards, policies, and procedures. It also provides consulting services on risk management, internal control designs, and implementation for the overall enhancement of efficiency, effectiveness, economy, transparency, accountability, and good governance.









CROPS DIVISION

The goal of the crops division is to engage in crop development and provide technical advisory services aimed at improving crop production for both subsistence and commercial stakeholders, including producers, processors, and marketers involved in fruit trees, spices, vegetables, root and tuber crops, and plantation crops.

The activities were implemented through the following sections of the Crops Division:

1. ADVISORY SECTION

The core function of the Advisory Section is to provide technical extension services through crop advisory and development services to improve crop production for primary producers of plantation crops, vegetables, root crops, fruit trees, nuts, and spices.

The effectiveness of agricultural extension tools relies on transparent communication and coordination with our stakeholders, partners, and program facilitators. The following approaches are adopted by the Advisory Section to ensure sustainable crop development:

- Collaborate and coordinate with farmers, farmers' groups and associations, village communities, youth groups, NGOs, Government agencies, schools, etc.
- Provide training programs such as Integrated Pest Management (IPM), farming systems, farming technologies, Plant Health Clinic (PHC), Farmer Field School (FFS), Export Pathways, Farm Management and Business Plans, Coconut Rhinoceros Beetle Control Programs, Field Visits, etc.
- Strong affiliations with organizations such as ACIAR/SPC/IPM/ICM, UNDP SGP, CSSP Agriculture Interventions, FAO Agriculture Interventions, PPCR Coconut, and Cocoa Replanting, etc., to assist in the execution of projects.







- Conduct regular Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) meetings and consultations with stakeholders from different communities and backgrounds.
- Raise public awareness through community outreach programs, TV, annual agricultural shows, open days, career days, special events, Radio, Publications, demonstrations, etc.
- Promote open-pollinated seed varieties in seed production to ensure consistent supply of seeds, food and nutrition security.

2. DEVELOPMENT SECTION

The core function of the **Development Section** is to engage in crop development and extension services, with a focus on improving crop production for primary producers involved in plantation crops, vegetables, root crops, fruit trees, nuts and spices.

The **Development Section** team caters to the public and communities by generating high-quality and sufficient planting materials to address the ongoing demand for crop planting resources.

Moreover, there is a showcasing of available farming technologies, farming systems, and crop-improved varieties. Additionally, in-field conservation of Plant Genetic Resources (PGR), including traditional varieties, is carried out.

ANIMAL PRODUCTION & HEALTH DIVISION

The goal of the Animal Production and Health Division is to conduct research and development, offering guidance and services on animal health to enhance livestock production for both subsistence and commercial producers.

The implementation of the activities are carried out under the following sections:

1. ANIMAL HEALTH AND REGULATORY SECTION

The section delivers proficient animal healthcare and treatment, guarantees the production of safe and suitable meat and meat products for human consumption, conducts import risk analysis for all animal cases, and secures certification for exports.

2. ANIMAL PRODUCTION AND ADVISORY SECTION

The section offers guidance and technical support to farmers with the aim of promoting and improving livestock production.

3. DEVELOPMENT SECTION

The section facilitates the advancement of technologies to enhance local livestock industries by the following activities:

 Develop innovative approaches to improve and promote livestock production, particularly focusing on breeding genetics and animal nutrition.

- Explore and analyze various farm management practices, including model farms for animal production and long-term economic sustainability.
- Oversee, track, and evaluate pasture species and feeding trials.
- Generate comprehensive reports based on research and technology development outcomes.
- Monitor and analyze livestock numbers, natural increase statistics, and stock growth on MAF farms.
- Implement livestock distribution schemes to benefit farmers.
- Oversee breeding programs for all stock on MAF.
- Provide support to design and construct livestock farming equipment and tools, and maintain MAF farm infrastructure.
- Provide technical assistance to apiary farmers.

4. SUPPORT SERVICES

The section provides administrative and general support services for the Animal Production and Health Division.

FISHERIES DIVISION

The implementation of the activities are carried out under the following sections:

1. ADVISORY SECTION

The section facilitates coastal communities' participation in fishing resource management and marine environment preservation through the Community-Based Fisheries Management Program (CBFMP). The program follows a "bottom-up" approach, that empowers communities to manage their aquatic, fisheries and marine resources.



2. COASTAL OR INSHORE FISHERIES SECTION

The section promotes sustainable coastal, fisheries and marine resources in Samoa through following responsibilities:

ecosystems. It advices Samoan government agencies, communities, NGOs, and stakeholders on aquaculture, coastal, and oceanic fisheries development and management. The Division also undertakes fisheries conservation,

- Conduct research on coastal fisheries resources and the marine environment to inform management decisions and assess their potential for development.
- Monitor developments in coastal fisheries for sustainability.
- Establish and advocate for conservation measures to ensure the sustainable utilization of fishery resources.
- Diversify coastal fisheries resources, including stock enhancement and value-adding, to promote food, nutritional security and livelihoods.
- Promote the health and resilience of coastal habitats and coral reef systems.
- Increase awareness and foster active participation among stakeholders in research activities.

FISHERIES DIVISION

- Perform market surveys, socio-economic surveys, stock assessments, habitat monitoring, and research on commercially important species: ciguatera, palolo, sea cucumbers, trochus, and edible seaweeds to determine how climate change impacts habitats.
- Collect and document Samoan coastal fisheries and marine habitats district profiles.

3. OCEANIC OR OFFSHORE FISHERIES SECTION

The section regulates Samoa's oceanic fisheries and progresses the commercial fisheries and processing by providing guidance on the following work areas:

- Monitor the yields of resources from fishing activities in Samoa's oceanic area.
- Develop and review pertinent regulations, tuna management and development plans, and fishing license and system terms to regulate fishing activities for oceanic fisheries resources.
- Develop and implement fisheries surveillance programs to ensure that oceanic fishing operators comply with conservation and management measures.
- Collect and evaluate fisheries and scientific data to better understand marine fish stocks dynamics, including population and biomass.
- Deploy and maintain fish-aggregating devices to support small-scale oceanic fisheries.
- Provide infrastructure support for rural smallscale fishermen.
- Provide policy advice and efforts to national forums to ensure Samoa's commercial tuna fisheries' profitability and viability.



- Develop systems of equivalency or compatibility with market state access requirements to secure the continuous exportation of fish from Samoa.
- Oversee a cabinet-sanctioned Commercial
 Fisheries Management Advisory Committee (CF-MAC) with government and industry members
 that engages frequently to address the
 management and development of Samoan
 commercial fisheries.

4. AQUACULTURE RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

The section is dedicated to cultivating aquatic organisms in various environments including freshwater, seawater, brackish water, and inland saline water. It actively promotes and develops aquaculture in Samoa to alleviate the pressure on marine fishing by introducing and restocking species in lagoons and reefs.

5. COMPETENT AUTHORITY OR SEAFOOD SAFETY AND VERIFICATION

The Competent Authority (CA) is the independent government agency responsible for the verification and certification of fish exports. The CA's overall objective is to ensure that the fish and fishery products originating from Samoa meet the needs of its trading partners or overseas markets.



BIOSECURITY DIVISION

The Biosecurity Division operates within the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries (MAF), guided by the Biosecurity Act of 2005, which mandates our efforts to prevent or manage the introduction and spread of pests and diseases that pose potential harm to human beings, animals, plants, and various elements of the environment or economic activities.



1. TECHNICAL POLICY SECTION

The section engages in conducting Import Risk Analyses (IRAs) for newly proposed imports and reviews existing import permits. Additionally, it conducts research on international health standards related to approved imports, aids in implementing policy advice, and compiles contact information regarding market access status with other importing and exporting countries.



2. AWARENESS SECTION

The section is dedicated to increasing public awareness on issues related to Samoa's biosecurity and ensuring relevant information is relayed appropriately Awareness Section.

3. PESTICIDE SECTION

The section is tasked with the registration, regulation, and supervision of all imported pesticides, overseeing their sale, safe usage, and distribution in Samoa. The enforcement of the Pesticides Regulation 2011 guarantees that only high-quality pesticides are permitted entry into Samoa.



BIOSECURITY DIVISION





The section plans, oversees, regulates, integrates, and evaluates the operational activities of the regulatory section, encompassing:

Fumigation Treatment: Dis-infestation treatment for export certification using Methyl Bromide Chemical and as required for import commodities.

Waterblasting: Disinfestation treatment for vehicles, machineries, and car parts.

Garbage Collection: Disposal of garbage from international aircraft and ships, as well as other potential sources of risk.

Incineration: Destruction of non-compliant agricultural commodities or confiscated items from various ports of entry at the incinerator.






Export Certification: Issuance of Phytosanitary and/or Zoosanitary Certificates following inspection and necessary treatment.

Surveillance and Monitoring: Inspection and audit of approved facilities for post-entry quarantine and packhouse and export facilities.

Site and Report: Surveillance for pest interception or disease, along with database entry for pest lists, virtual collection, and the management of pest samples.

The Policy, Planning, and Sector Coordination Division develops evidence-based policies in line with sectoral and national goals. Additionally, it collects, organizes, analyzes, and disseminates agricultural statistics, as well as providing communication services.

SAVAI'I OPERATION DIVISION




The Savai'i Operation Division covers three (3) technical divisions: crops, animal production and health, and the fisheries division. Each division has the same service as the divisions in Upolu.


Provide effective and efficient financial services and advice, enabling financial resources to be effectively planned, monitored, and reported upon.
